HILLTOP STAKES — 1 MILE (TURF)

Race #9—ANALYSIS OF TOP CONTENDERS

#4 PIZZA BIANCA – She is last year's G1 BC Juvenile Filly Turf winner and her next effort after a five-month break resulted in a second only losing by ¾ of a length in a stakes race at Aqueduct.

#8 VERGARA – Her first three starts were outstanding. She took a 4-months break, but her return was disappointing, as she came into the stretch six wide and finished eighth. That was her first race on synthetic and now is back to the footing she likes.

#7 MURPH – She tried turf and routing for the first time at Laurel Park and showed she can manage those conditions. She is trained by Brittany Russell who has already won three out of five starts during the this meet and jockey Jevian Toledo has won six out of nine starts.

VALUE PLAYS AND LONGSHOTS

#6 DIAMOND HANDS – She won her last race at Belmont last November and has taken a six-months break but has been working well for her return to compete in this race.

#1 DETERMINED GOLD – She is a maiden, but an expensive one costing \$295,000. She has shown some talent and has turf ability as she demonstrated in April at Keenland finishing second against the boys. Other than Pizza Bianca her Beyers are in line with the rest of the field.

#5 DETERMINED STAR – She finished eighth in her last race after a terrible start in her first start in five months. She is back vs. 3yos only and has been working well since.

PACE ANALYSIS

EARLY SPEED: Diamond Hands

STALKERS: Murph, Vergara

CLOSERS: Determined Gold, Lady Puchi, Hail To, Pizza Bianca Determined Star MURPH and VERGARA will likely be pilot and co-pilot at the first call as there isn't much separating the pair. Closer, PIZZA BIANCA could be closer to the front that expected as she has better early run than the rest.

THE **PLAY**

PIZZA BIANCA never ran off the board in four starts with a pair of wins and a pair of competitive seconds. **VERGARA** showed some early pop in previous races and gest first time Lasix today. That can be a winning combination. **MURPH** tried grass for the first time in her last race and she set a personal best speed figure. **DIAMOND HANDS** has not run since November but her speed figures where on par with this bunch and she could be plenty better as a three year old.

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

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





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Projected Pace Pay attention to the track bias: If horses are <u>winning from the front</u> consider the horses with the strongest <u>Early Pace</u> Projections and decent LP numbers. If <u>closers</u> are scoring, then <u>Late Pace</u> strength should be considered.

Pace Analysis...

There is a total of (20) Quirin Points in a race that should favor horses coming from off the pace. Of the (27) races recorded (71%) have ben won by EP and P type runners. Note that (75%) of these type of races have been won by horses below odds of (5:1).

(6) is the lone one-dimensional horse in this race, to the inside are all horses with running styles to run from off the pace. The (6 -7-8) should be battling for position on or near the front end out of the starting gate.



The **Red Dot** is the horse's Average Speed Figure relative to the other horses in the field.

The top of the line is the maximum speed number achieved versus the rest of the field. The highest line is the horse with the top speed figure for this group.

The bottom of the line is the worst speed figure for the horse compared to the rest of the field. The lowest line is the horse with the lowest speed number.
